Clery Act Report

Introduction

This report is provided in compliance with the Clery Act. It contains information regarding campus security policies, crime statistics, fire safety systems, and emergency procedures for Justice University.

This report is published annually and made available to all current and prospective students and employees.

Campus Security Policies

Justice University is committed to maintaining a safe and secure environment for all students, staff, and visitors. While the University does not maintain a campus police department, safety is supported through administrative staff, residential life personnel, and coordination with local law enforcement when necessary.

The University provides the following on-campus safety measures:

- A night security guard is on duty to monitor campus during overnight hours
- A Resident Director (RD) resides on campus year-round to provide oversight and respond to student needs and emergencies
- Each dormitory is assigned a Resident Assistant (RA) who supports students and assists with safety, policy enforcement, and incident reporting

Students and employees are encouraged to report any suspicious activity, criminal behavior, or emergencies immediately.

Campus access to residential dormitories and facilities is limited to residents and authorized individuals. Students are expected to follow all university policies related to safety, conduct, and community standards.

Reporting Criminal Activity

All students and employees are encouraged to report criminal incidents or suspicious behavior to:

- Resident Assistants (RA)
- Resident Directors (RD)
- University Administration
- Local law enforcement (911 in emergencies)

Reports may be made in person or through university communication channels. The University will assess all reports and determine appropriate action.

Timely Warning Notifications

Justice University provides timely warnings to the campus community in the event of a serious or ongoing threat.

Notifications are sent through the University's student portal system and may include:

- Text message alerts
- Email notifications

These notifications are intended to provide relevant safety information and recommended actions.

Emergency Response and Evacuation Procedures

In the event of an emergency, students should:

- Contact a Resident Assistant (RA), Resident Director (RD), or dial 911
- Follow instructions provided by university staff or emergency personnel

Evacuation procedures are clearly posted at the front door of each dormitory. Students are expected to familiarize themselves with these procedures and exit routes.

All dormitories include:

- Front and rear exit points
- Basement fire escape ladders located in bedrooms and common areas

Missing Student Notification Policy

Justice University takes student safety seriously. Any report of a missing student will be investigated immediately.

If a student residing in campus housing is believed to be missing:

1. The incident should be reported immediately to a Resident Assistant (RA), Resident Director (RD), or University Administration.
2. The University will initiate an investigation to determine the student’s whereabouts.
3. If the student is determined to be missing for 24 hours, the University will notify local law enforcement.
4. If the student has an emergency contact, that individual will be notified.
5. For students under the age of 18, a parent or legal guardian will also be notified.

Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking

Justice University prohibits all forms of sexual misconduct, including sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking.

The University is committed to:

- Providing a safe reporting environment
- Offering support to individuals impacted by misconduct
- Taking appropriate disciplinary action when necessary

Students are encouraged to report incidents to University administration or local law enforcement.

Available responses may include:

- Assistance with contacting law enforcement
- Academic or housing accommodations
- Access to counseling resources

All reports will be handled with sensitivity and respect for privacy, consistent with applicable laws and university policies.

Fire Safety Systems

Each dormitory at Justice University is equipped with:

- Commercial-grade smoke detectors
- Fire alarm systems
- Fire sprinkler systems

These systems are located in:

- Individual rooms
- Kitchens
- Common areas

All systems are regularly maintained to ensure proper operation.

Fire Drills and Evacuation Procedures

Fire drills are conducted periodically to ensure student preparedness.

In the event of a fire alarm:

- Students must immediately evacuate the building
- Use the nearest exit (front or back of dorm)
- Do not use stairs
- Gather at a safe distance away from the building

Basement areas include fire escape ladders in both bedrooms and common areas to provide additional exit routes.

Fire Safety Policies

To reduce fire risk, the following items are prohibited in dormitories:

- Candles
- Space heaters
- Open flames
- Any appliance or device that poses a fire hazard

Students are expected to comply with all fire safety regulations. Violations may result in disciplinary action.
